8. Teachers Report- Ms. Yoner-

Teacher Report:

Ms. Richmond is going to start planning the SNAP math fair with the Grade 8 classes after the Easter break. We will be using some class time to work on creating our critical thinking brain teaser puzzles from now until then. It will be run as a science fair would, with parents invited and circulating through the students' puzzle projects. The idea is to have some kind of a completion passport that will gain parents' entries into our draws throughout the evening. The students will be working together to create a letter for community businesses and groups explaining our fair, as well as asking if they would be interested in donating anything for our prize draws. Ms. Richmond is hoping that the kids will distribute the letters, as well as pick up any prizes that are offered. The goal is to have this as student lead as possible. The plan is for the students' to also send the same letter to our division office to ask for the possibility of our division's support for our evening/prize draws. The hope is to have the SNAP fair occur one weekday evening at the beginning of June (tentative, June 1st, 5th, 6th but no discussion has been had around these dates yet)

The latest winners of the CHAT Math Challenge were Cameron Akitt (subway \$10) and Siwon Park (\$10 dollar store). Ms. Richmond will have the receipts for those prizes for the school council at the May meeting. Thank you again for your support in this! Update on the Newsletter Brain Teaser challenges - still very low on number of submissions...same 1-2 families each month.

Ms. Richmond has been in conversation with Robby Findlay about the possibility of him coming in to do a presentation to the Math 20-3 and 30-3 classes around savings and investing. This would happen sometime mid-May, but no date has been set yet. Ms. Richmond is also wondering about the possibility of the same presentation being done for the grade 9 math class.

Epic Field Trip for Grade 9s happened today, Ms. Richmond will update on how it went at the May meeting.

Ms. James' last day is tomorrow and she had the new social studies teacher (Kristen Suderman) shadowing her today to meet the students. After Easter break the new teacher will hit the ground running and will be teaching social 30-1, 20-1, 10 and criminal justice. Ms. MacLeod will be taking over the Learning Support position.

Ms. James also took her Criminal Justice students to the jail in Lethbridge this month, and the students found that very educational. They had a drug dog do a demonstration for them.

Ms. Seamen had a grade 8 science fair on mechanical systems. She was very proud of the work that the students did on this project.

Ms. Yoner's 10C class did a cake pops project early this month for the surface area and measurement unit. The students had to determine surface area, volume and make unit conversions for their cake pops and their cake cones that they made.

Ms. Yoner had her 30-2 students do an archaeology project using carbon dating. The grade 12's have to use a half-life equation to determine the amount of carbon left in their artifact. Then the students had to describe the different aspects of the exponential functions they were studying.

Ms. MacLeod is in the early stages of planning a trip to Frank Slide INterpretive Centre with her grade 7 students. She is hoping for late April or early May if everything goes smoothly.

Ms. Dobson and myself will be taking grade 10 students to Olds College on May 10th. Yesterday she went around to the grade 10 Chat classes to try to get an idea on what numbers to expect and if there is still room afterwards she might open it up to some grade 11's.
